

The Moravian missionaries contemplate an advance farther north, and hope to establish a station at Leh, the capital of Ladakh, so soon as the objections of the Maharajah of Cashmere can be overcome, and his permission obtained for the commencement of a Christian Mission in that part of his territories. For their missionary purposes no better position could be occupied. Leh is a considerable town, with a large Buddhist monastery in its immediate neighbourhood; it is the centre or meeting point of four lines of traffic, and is on the high road between Cashmere and Lhassa, the great seat of Buddhism in Tibet. Even in their comparatively remote station at Kyelang the missionaries have from time to time collected valuable information regarding the affairs of countries of central Asia, including Ladakh, Kashghar, Mongolia, Chinese Tibet, and Tibet Proper. Advanced to Leh, they would be in a position to add greatly to their stores of information and knowledge of those countries. The lofty spirit of self-abnegation with which the Moravian missionaries have laboured for so many years in their remote settlements on the Northern frontiers of British India, can best be understood and appreciated by those who have visited their station. Far removed from civilized life, themselves simple, frugal, and self-denying, they spend their days in labouring hard for...
